Enrique Quijano is a bilingual journalist with 20-plus years of experience as a news reporter and editor. Quijano has worked for several bilingual publications, gaining extensive experience covering such subjects as Entertainment, Politics, Health, Economy, Technology, and Education. Along with his reporting background, Quijano has extensive experience as a translator, having provided Spanish-English bilingual versions of many news articles.

Enrique has worked for The Dallas Morning News and The Fort-Worth Star Telegram newspapers, both in Dallas, Texas; The Sacramento Bee in California; and other news outlets. In 2012, Enrique was responsible for launching a new newspaper for the Archdiocese of San Francisco, establishing the publication's content and design, managing and producing it.
